

**MINUTES OF THE EMERGENCY MEETING OF THE BOARD OF
COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, CLARK COUNTY, IDAHO**

March 23, 2018

An Emergency Meeting was called on March 23, 2018 at 1243pm, located in the Clark County Commissioners Room, 224 W. Main Street, Dubois, ID 83423.

Clark County Commissioners and Emergency Management called an emergency meeting to discuss flooding that had taken place around the county. The meeting was called in order to declare a State of Emergency.

Motion

Motion by Commissioner Nick Hillman to sign Resolution 2018-04 for Emergency Funding; stating the Emergency in Clark County will be in place for up to a 90 day period.

Seconded by Commissioner MaCoy Ward, Unanimous

Resolution 2018-04 was issued because of snow melt and rain that is creating heavy sheet flooding, water flows, and runoff throughout Clark County. The flooding is causing erosion of roads, damage to structures, endangerment of property and life, all located in Clark County, Idaho. If the heavy water flows and sheet flooding are not managed and erosion, roads and embankments are not immediately repaired the flooding will continue to occur in Clark County causing a runoff disaster. The Board of County Commissioners of Clark County declared this a State of Emergency and authorizes the expenditures of Clark County Funds necessary to meet the needs during this emergency. This resolution was adopted by The Board of County Commissioners on March 23, 2018.

A letter was also submitted to the Idaho Office of Emergency Management in Boise, Idaho, to designate Darrin May and Jill Egan to work with the office in receiving and spending funds related to the disaster. Clark County fully expects the State of Idaho to share in the expense at a rate of 50/50 as it relates to a disaster declaration.
